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| 1.0 | Introduction  |
| 1.1 | Student Volunteering Cardiff (SVC) recognises Welsh has a status in Wales,<br>encompassed within the Welsh Language (Wales) Measure 2011, and the<br>Welsh Language Act 1993. It recognises the public in Wales have a Welsh<br>Language and therefore must receive a bilingual service from the public<br>institutions that work in Wales. |
|     | In recognition of this, and of other related factors such as Human Rights, SVC acknowledges the need to provide proactive choice of language for our staff, partners and volunteers.  |
|     | Furthermore in keeping with Welsh Government Policy - specifically 'Cymraeg 2050 - a million Welsh speakers' - SVC seeks to foster bilingualism in Wales, and extend positive choices and opportunities for staff, agencies in the field, and for the general public  |

| 3.1 | Welsh and English are the official languages of SVC. SVC is committed to providing an equally high standard of service in Welsh and English.  |

|     | SVC will encourage amongst its volunteers, Trustees and the staff who support<br>SVC, a positive awareness of, and understanding about, the Welsh language<br>and bilingualism as a valued aspect of human diversity and modern Wales.     |

| 4.1 | New Policies and Initiatives<br>New Policies and Initiatives adopted will promote and facilitate the use of<br>Welsh whenever possible and move the organisation closer to implementing<br>the principle of equality at every opportunity. |

| 4.2 | <b>Standard of Welsh Service</b><br>SVC is firmly committed to providing an equal standard of service in Welsh<br>and English and welcomes dealings in both languages.   |
|     | Our aim is to provide a high standard of service in every aspect of SVC's work, both verbally and in writing, in accordance with its commitments to this scheme.   |
|     | SVC will publicise the scheme and will monitor and review the standards it is achieving, with the aim of continually improving the standard.   |

| 5.1 | Written Correspondence   |
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|     | SVC welcomes written correspondence (in writing or via email) either in            |
|     | Welsh or in English, and the response will be made in the language of the          |
|     | original correspondence.   |
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|     | Letters sent to individuals and groups who have approached SVC in the Welsh        |
|     | language will be responded to in Welsh.  |
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| 5.2 | Telephone communication  |
|     | Telephone calls received by SVC will be answered initially in English as           |
|     | currently SVC has no Welsh speaking staff. However if a caller prefers to          |
|     | communicate in Welsh then SVC will return the call in the medium of Welsh,         |
|     | through one of our Welsh speaking Trustees.  |
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| 5.3 | Training   |
|     | SVC will promote demand for training through the medium of Welsh through           |
|     | consultation with current and potential volunteers.                                |
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| 6.0 | SVC's Public Image   |
| 6.1 | Publishing   |
|     | SVC will endeavour for its published documents, forms and promotional              |
|     | literature to be available bilingually.  |
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| 6.2 | Website  |
|     | SVC's website is predominantly in English. However key areas of the site are       |
|     | bilingual. An action plan is being developed so that the creation and              |
|     | maintenance of a fully bilingual website is put in place.                          |
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| 6.3 | Staff Recruitment and Advertising  |
|     | At present all posts within SVC have "the ability to communicate in Welsh" as      |
|     | a desirable criteria. Should the requirements of the people who access our         |
|     | services change then SVC will amend these roles accordingly.                       |
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| 7.0 | Implementing and Monitoring the Welsh Language Policy                              |
| 7.1 | Learning Welsh   |
|     | SVC encourages staff to learn Welsh and will support staff wishing to learn /      |
|     | improve their current language skills, on a practical level.                       |
| 7.2 | Translation  |
|     | Appointing translators – SVC is committed to ensuring that the charity's           |
|     | translators, be they internal or external, are suitably qualified and are able to  |
|     | provide a high quality service.  |
|     | SVC will work with local translation businesses, the Welsh School at Cardiff       |
|     | University, the three local Universities and associated Students' Unions to        |
|     | ensure that standards are of the highest quality, and ensure we utilise the latest |
|     | translation technology.  |
